

TUHSD SPRING 2021

TUHSD was prepared to return to Hybrid, in-person learning for all 5200 students, across five campuses on Jan 6
Marin moved to Red Tier Feb 23, returned to in person learning 5 days later (Mar 2)

- **3 cohorts** necessary with 6 feet social distancing (CDC, Teachers MOU)
- Universal mask wearing
- Hand washing

MEASURES UNDERTAKEN BY TUHSD

- We used funds provided in federal subsidy (CARES Act) to:
 - Install high-quality ventilation
 - Set up tents for outdoor eating, class gathering
 - Provide on-site COVID testing for staff and students
 - Provide professional development and updated technology
 - PPE
- Labor unions (TFT and CSEA) have not demanded vaccination before returning to classroom
- Vaccines available to Teachers & Staff; goal of Apr 2 for all

HOW ARE PRIVATE & K-8 SCHOOLS DIFFERENT?

- K-8 able to maintain stable cohorts, not changing classes, teachers and rooms
- Private school Teachers/Staff are not part of a union with MOUs in place
- Private school enrollment much lower which accommodates social distancing

CONSTRAINTS (non-negotiables)

- Complex schedules for all students (A-G, electives, AP)
- Since social distancing is mandated, TUHSD cannot return to full-time in person learning due to space constrictions
- TUHSD cannot supersede CDPH guidelines
- Use of temp structures (tents, portables), controlled by local ordinances

OPEN TOPICS (negotiables)

- **2 cohorts** if/when MOU renegotiated to **4** feet social distancing (CDPH)
- Alternative classroom space

FALL 2021

TUHSD is fully committed to returning to full time, in-person learning

This will be entirely dependent on CDPH guidelines

Plan A

Full Time, in person as usual
Universal mask wearing still required

Plan B

- if social distancing of 4 ft is still required, will need additional classrooms (tents) and teachers = \$4-6.8M
- + also exploring possibility of potential rentable space in vicinity of our schools (e.g. community centers)
- + working w/MCOE to identify potential shared solutions
