Student Council and Drake Leadership/Associated Student Body (ASB) Drake’s Student Council and Associated Student Body (ASB) organization strives to engage and involve students in building strong and cohesive leadership skills, school unity and increased student involvement on campus and in the community. Peer Resource Peer Resource is an elective class where students are trained to support fellow students by providing peer education and counseling, conflict-mediation, parent education panels, and outreach at local middle schools when requested. Link Crew is a high school orientation and transition program that increases freshman success. Members of the junior and senior class are trained to be Link Crew Leaders who act as positive role models, motivators, student mentors and teachers helping guide the freshmen to discover what it takes to be successful during their high school transition.

Community Service Students are required to complete 10-35 hrs. of community service in 9th and 10th grade depending on their Small Learning Community. Students can access community service opportunities by inquiring in the main office.

COUNSELING AND WELLNESS SUPPORT SERVICES FOR DRAKE STUDENTS

Counseling and Academic Advising Counseling is a critical component of Drake's support for students. Upon entering Drake, each student will be assigned a counselor who will assist and support each student's academic, social/emotional, career and personal adjustment needs by providing opportunities for students to utilize the counselor as a resource for social/emotional support as well as post-secondary educational/career plans. The Counseling staff, in conjunction with the College & Career Specialist, provide grade specific informational programs and communications for parents and students throughout the year. Encourage your student to get to know their counselor. They make a positive impact on our students every day!

Drake's Wellness Center The Drake Wellness Center offers additional support services to students, in collaboration with Drake's Counseling Department, that focus on health, mental health, substance abuse/use and sexual health. The Wellness Center offers direct services to students (ex: 1:1 counseling, nursing services, case management, and support groups) as well as classroom workshops and school wide events focusing on prevention and education. The Drake Wellness Center also coordinates with Bay Area Community Resources (BACR) to provide on-site counseling/mental health services. The BACR counselors work within the Wellness Center to provide support for stress, depression, substance abuse, academic pressure and interpersonal relationship issues. They provide crisis counseling as needed and primarily work with students who do not have medical coverage for mental health issues outside of school. COLLEGE AND CAREER CENTER FOR DRAKE STUDENTS

College & Career Center The College & Career Center is located right next door to Counseling and provides a wealth of materials designed to assist students with college search and career planning. Our library has career abstracts, college brochures, military options, study abroad/summer/gap year programs, scholarship information, brochures and information on test prep companies and individual tutors, as well as SAT/ACT books that students can borrow as they prepare for these tests. We offer web-based college, career, and scholarship searches and continually host college reps, career speakers, essay workshops, college application workshops, and practice tests to help students better prepare for the SAT/ACT.
