COUNSELING AND WELLNESS SUPPORT SERVICES FOR DRAKE STUDENTS

Counseling and Academic Advising

Counseling is a critical component of Drake's support for students. Upon entering Drake, each student will be assigned a counselor who will assist and support each student's academic, social/emotional, career and personal adjustment needs by providing opportunities for students to utilize the counselor as a resource for social/emotional support as well as post-secondary educational/career plans. The Counseling staff, in conjunction with the College & Career Specialist, provide grade specific informational programs and communications for parents and students throughout the year. Encourage your student to get to know their counselor. They make a positive impact on our students every day!

Drake's Wellness Center

The Drake Wellness Center offers additional support services to students, in collaboration with Drake's Counseling Department, that focus on health, mental health, substance abuse/use and sexual health. The Wellness Center offers direct services to students (ex: 1:1 counseling, nursing services, case management, and support groups) as well as classroom workshops and school wide events focusing on prevention and education. The Drake Wellness Center also coordinates with Bay Area Community Resources (BACR) to provide on-site counseling/mental health services. The BACR counselors work within the Wellness Center to provide support for stress, depression, substance abuse, academic pressure and interpersonal relationship issues. They provide crisis counseling as needed and primarily work with students who do not have medical coverage for mental health issues outside of school.
