The 2019 Youth Poster Contest is now open for all Marin youth, ages 12 through 18. Running through May 3, the poster contest provides an unprecedented and very public platform to let the voice of our youth be heard!

Marin youth, ages 12-18, are invited to design an art poster that communicates their hopes and concerns about social justice, women's rights, immigration, climate change, firearms regulation, and other issues important to them.

Using art, creative ideas and problem-solving skills, youth will develop a poster that informs, challenges and inspires the community to take action and make a difference, especially in these troubling times.

Over \$2,200 in prizes will be awarded prizes to the winners and for their school or organization, in two age categories, 12-14 and 15-18. Following the contest, the finalist and winning posters will be taken on a Bay Area exhibition tour, including a special presentation at the 2019 Marin County Fair.

**MCAL EXPECTATION AT ATHLETIC EVENTS:**

- Work with each other ahead of time about sportsmanship.
- Keep students off field/courts/pool. Non-participating students shall stay off all playing areas during, before, and at half time of any contests.
- Watch for unsportsmanlike acts, chants, yells from crowd. Don't be afraid to eject students/parents for inappropriate behavior. Including but not limited to:

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• turned backs</li> <li>• newspapers in front of face</li> <li>• cheers based at harassing the other school</li> <li>• yells directed toward a player on the opposing team</li> <li>• yells directed toward the opposing school</li> <li>• yells directed toward the official(s) or booing.</li> <li>• harassing other team's players</li> <li>• profanity</li> <li>• offensive signs</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• responding to the other school's inappropriate cheers</li> <li>• Fans should never interfere with officials, team warm up or playing of the game.</li> <li>• All types of noisemakers are prohibited: such as sirens, tooters, cowbells, megaphones, squawkers, etc., shall be prohibited at all indoor contests. Additionally, noisemakers are not allowed at NCS post season events.</li> <li>• sitting in the other school's designated cheering area</li> </ul>

- An official may award a technical foul to a team for unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of a coach, player, spectator or cheering section. Administrators may remove a spectator for inappropriate behavior. Repeated unsportsmanlike conduct, particularly on the part of the cheering section or individual spectators, may cause forfeiture of the contest.
- Cheering Sections: Should focus on team support
