

SCHEDULING TIPS FOR SENIOR YEAR

All students must request at least six classes. Students are **NOT GUARANTEED** a “No 1st” or “No 7th” but you can request your preference found under “Non Departmental” in the Course Request section of Home Access.

You will automatically be enrolled in the required senior year courses:

- Social Studies: American Government/Economics

Social Studies: If electing to take AP Economics instead of Economics, select AP Economics/American Government and uncheck American Government/Economics.

English: All English courses are yearlong, either AP or pairings (fall/spring). Please make sure that you also request alternates as your first request is not guaranteed. NOTE: you cannot request an English course you’ve already completed your junior year.

Math: Please plan your senior year math class with your current math teacher who will enter your choice. A fourth year of Math is not required but is recommended. For 4-year college eligibility, completion of Intermediate or Advanced Algebra is required.

Science: A fourth year of science is not required, but is recommended. Some science courses have prerequisites. Please check to ensure you meet requirements for a requested science course.

World Language: Passing the second year of a world language (Spanish or French 3-4) is required by most 4-year colleges. Three or more years is recommended. World language is **not** a requirement for graduation.

Fine Arts: One year is required for graduation and college eligibility.

Enrollment in Advanced Placement/Honors courses depends on meeting course entrance requirements. Please review the [AP/Honors Informational Matrix](#)

Choose your electives and **alternates** carefully. The classes you choose cannot be changed next school year. Listing **at least two alternates** increases the likelihood of your schedule matching your interests.

You cannot select Peer Resource or Leadership because there is an application process. You must select another elective course you will take in case you are not accepted.
