

SCHEDULING TIPS FOR SOPHOMORE YEAR

All students must request at least six classes. Students are NOT GUARANTEED a “No 1st” or “No 7th” but you can request your preference found under “Non Departmental” in the Course Request section of Home Access.

You will automatically be enrolled in the required sophomore year courses:

- Social Studies: World History 1-2
- English 3-4
- Math (your current math teacher will do this for you)
- The Living Earth
- Physical Education 3-4

Social Studies: If requesting AP European History instead of World History, select AP European History and uncheck World History.

Math: Math will be selected for you by your current math teacher.

World Language: Passing the second year of a world language (Spanish or French 3-4) is required by most 4-year colleges. Three or more years is recommended. World language is **not** a requirement for graduation.

Fine Arts: One year is required for graduation and college eligibility.

Enrollment in Advanced Placement/Honors courses depends on meeting course entrance requirements. Please review the AP/Honors Informational Matrix

Choose your electives and **alternates** carefully. The classes you choose cannot be changed next school year. Listing **at least two alternates** increases the likelihood of your schedule matching your interests.

Peer Resource, Leadership and TV & Media Production have applications. If you request one of these classes, applications will be made available to you. If you request Peer Resource, ensure that you also request an alternate.
